Sycamore (T1) - crown lift to maintain stability because of danger of pushing wall and is extending over the pavement and road side
Sycamore (T2) - Crown clean to maintain stability
Sycamore (T3) - Crown clean and dead wood to maintain stability
Home Oak (T4) - Crown clean and dead wood to maintain stability
Horse Chestnut (T5) fell because it looks diseased and is causing excessive shading. Replant with Mountain Ash
Sycamore (T6) Fell because it is unstable
Leyland Trees (T7,8 & 9) Crown reduce by 30% causing excessive shading and provide stability
Cherry (T10) - Fell, unable to thrive in current position
Beech Trees (T11,12, and 13) Crown reduce by 30% because causing excessive shading and maintain stability
Maple Tree (T14) Crown Reduce by 30% because causing excessive shading and to maintain stability
Lime Tree (T15) Crown lift and Reduce by 30% and remove leaving stem (NW side) to the right; because causing excessive shading and to maintain stability
Cherry Tree (T16) Crown Reduce by 30% because it is too tall and causing excessive shading
