Drainage Details

The existing golf range is very well drained with no evidence of excess surface water after heavy rainfall.

The use of the additional material will not affect the drainage of the site, and the use of further drainage systems is not necessary.

There are no new buildings to be added to the site.

Flood Risk

The enclosed Environmental Agency plan show that there are no flood zones near to the site.

Because the application does not include new buildings, it is deemed that the Flood Risk to the site is negligible

Transport statement.

Existing

The existing site is accessed from Caldway Drive, which is a two way road which serves mainly the housing estate to the west of the site.

A short survey shows that highest hourly traffic rate is 31 cars, 2 commercial vehicles and 2 buses. In other words, this a not a busy road.

There is very little pedestrian usage, on either side of the road.

The access from Caldway Drive onto the Golf range is unobstructed with good visibility towards both directions.

Proposed Development

The alterations to the site cannot be classed as major development, but the proposed plan does involve a large increase in haulage wagons entering the site. In addition the wagons do need wheel cleaning to prevent contamination of the highway

The residents are sufficiently distanced from the site to be unduly inconvenienced by excess vehicle noise

There will be a very little impact on other road users and pedestrians from the development of the site.

At the end of the proposed development, the roads etc will return to their previous conditions.

Management Plan

The number of wagons delivering inert materials will not exceed 15 per day.

Wagon delivery times will be between 8.00am - 5.00pm. excluding Sat afternoon & Sunday.

Work on the site will be between 8.00am - 7.00pm; excluding Sunday.

The enclosed plan shows that a stoned driveway will be formed to provide access to the tipping area and wheel wash area. This will reduce the collection of mud around the trucks on the site itself. The wheel washing will be done if necessary with high pressure hose.

On entry to the site a banksman will supervise the wagon to the tipping and turning area.

The banksman will ensure that no other persons are in, or about to come in the wagons route.

Before tipping, the material will be examined to make sure it complies with the specifications.

Once paperwork has been signed, the banksman will escort the driver to the site exit.

The tipped material will be delivered to the appropriate area of the site by dumper truck.

A 13 ton excavator will also used on the site.

The start date is June 1st 2015 with provisional closing date of 1st November. 2015.

The total amount of required inert materials is estimated at 28,000 tons.

Other information

The site address is Liverpool Golf Centre & Driving Range., Caldway Drive, Liverpool L 27 OBY

We confirm that the proposal is NOT for landfill or waster reception, and that materials will be used for landscaping.

Once the landscaping features have been formed, the features will be covered by 150mm topsoil and grass seeded.

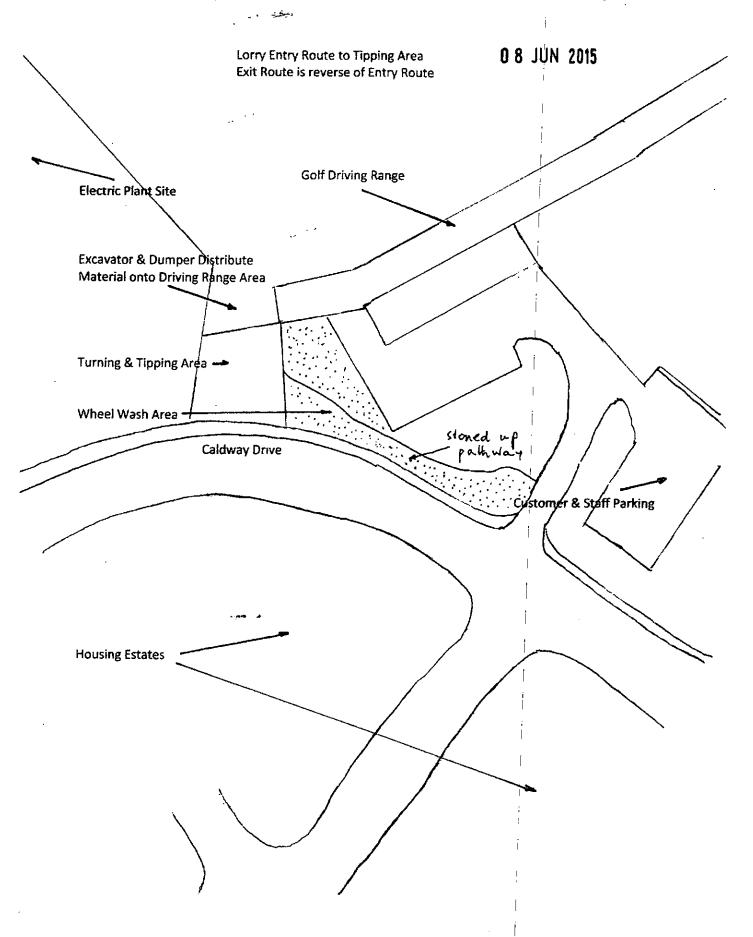
