Notes to the Application

This application was made online on 14th March 2015. This additional paperwork has been supplied now to support the application.

The application is needed for the import of inert materials to the Golf Range on Caldway Drive, Liverpool L27 OBY, for landscaping purposes, in order to improve the golfing facilities.

The imported material is required for the following features.

- 1. To form a ramp around the range area to enable the range to increase the perimeter fencing and also form a barrier to rolling golf balls going into surrounding land and especially onto the adjoining golf course, Childwall Golf Club. We have had some complaints from Childwall GC concerning stray balls reaching their fairways.
- 2. To infill land shown hatched on the plan. The land slopes away going to the South East of the range. We intend to level this land and landscape the area for future use, Eg new raised pitching greens to complement our short game practice area.
- 3. To form up to 3 new greens on the range as per the plan.


Environmental Agency






