

Public Transport Access and Facilities

Bus Access

Due to the Campus' City Centre location, access to the city by bus is good. Frequent services operate from within and outside the Liverpool City Region. Several bus stops are located around the perimeter of the campus (Figure A.14). Additional services can be accessed from Queens Square and Liverpool One bus stations, located within a 15 minute and 19 minute walk of University Square.





There are a large number of bus services running at a high frequency in close proximity to the North Campus. The majority of these services stop on Pembroke Place, London Road and Prescot Street. The North Campus is served well during the week, evenings, Saturdays and Sundays. The majority of services serving the North Campus operate at a frequency of at least 15 minutes on a week day.

Those services that operate along Brownlow Hill serve the North and Central Campus to stops located on Oxford Street/Abercromby Square and Mount Pleasant. There are fewer services operating within and around the Central Campus, with the majority of services running at a frequency closer to every 20 minutes during the weekday peak and less often during evenings and Sundays.

Services operate in close proximity to the South Campus on Myrtle Street, Hope Street and Grove Street. However, only a limited number of services operate from Hope Street and Grove Street. The majority of services that directly serve the South Campus operate at an average frequency of around 20 minutes during the weekday peak hours.

Table A.3 shows the services and frequency of services serving the North, Central and South Campus.

The quality of waiting infrastructure is generally good including shelters, seating and timetables on key corridors such as Brownlow Hill, Oxford Street and Pembroke Place. Table A.4 summarises the results of a bus stop audit that was undertaken on campus. The majority of bus stops are in good condition. 16 of the 37 stops audited contain seating, a shelter, Kassel kerbs and bus timetable information as shown in Figure A.15.

The audit was presented to Merseytravel, it was agreed by Merseytravel that some bus stops would



benefit from being upgraded along Grove Street, Crown Street, Melville Place and Myrtle Street as shown in Figure A.16. Potential improvements include maintenance of road markings or installation of seating and/or shelter.





It should be noted that there are 5 stops not in service due to major building works taking place immediately adjacent to Apex 2 and the Royal Liverpool University Hospital. These stops are expected to be reinstated upon completion of the relevant works.



Rail Access

The main Campus is in close proximity to Liverpool Lime Street and Liverpool Central. Liverpool Lime Street (Figure A.18) is located approximately 1km (12 minute walk) from University Square. Liverpool Central is situated located approximately 900m (11 minute walk) from University Square.

Virgin, London Midland and North Western trains serve Lime Street providing frequent services across the country including, Warrington, Manchester, Birmingham, Blackpool, London Leeds, Nottingham, Scarborough and York. Liverpool Lime Street also forms part of the Merseyrail Wirral Line and City Line network, providing access to the wider Liverpool City Region.





Liverpool Central Station forms the main hub of the Merseyrail network serving both the Northern Line and Wirral Line, covering the Liverpool, Sefton, Wirral and Knowsley regions (Figure A.19). Liverpool Central provides services every 15 minutes during the daytime on each of the Northern and Wirral lines. Services are reduced to a 30minute frequency on each line on a Sunday and in the evening, except for the Southport line which continues to operate on a 15 minute frequency Mon-Sat. Table A.5 presents services, frequency and hours of operation of all Merseyrail services.


Rail is a popular modal choice for staff and students. Lime Street and Central stations are located a short walk from the University at the base of Brownlow Hill and Mount Pleasant. However, the increased gradient of Brownlow Hill and Mount Pleasant is perceived barrier to rail travel for a number of staff and students.

Ferry Access

The Mersey ferry terminal is located approximately 2.5km away from University Square, approximately a 25 minute walk or a 10 minute cycle ride and provides another public transport link between Wirral (Seacombe) and Liverpoo I(the Pier Head) across the River Mersey.

A regular weekday commuter service between Seacombe Terminal and Liverpool Pier Head runs from 07:20-09:50 in the morning and 17:00-18:50 in the evening at 20 minute intervals. A journey across the River Mersey takes approximately 10 minutes by ferry and a bicycle can be taken on board. Free parking is available from Seacombe Ferry Terminal, with discounted weekly, monthly, quarterly and annual passes available.

Cycling Access


There are a number of on and off-road cycle routes in the vicinity of the University (Figure A.20), most notably the 'University Cycle Route' (Figure A.21). It should be noted however that a number of the recommended on-street cycle routes are A roads with high traffic volumes particularly in the AM and PM peaks.



In February 2014 a main campus cycle storage audit was undertaken on site by the University of Liverpool Facilities Management department to assess the utilisation rates of cycle storage facilities and the location of these facilities. A total of 675 cycle parking spaces were recorded, ranging from secure shelters to Sheffield stands (Figure A.22). The location of cycle parking is presented in Figure A.23.




Figure A.22: Cycle Storage Facilities on the Main Campus












Pedestrian Access

As the University is located within the City Centre, the campus is well connected to the wider City footpath network. Much of the walking environment within the Central Campus is of a high standard (Figure A.24).





Following an upgrade to the public realm of central routes through campus, Chatham Street, Cambridge Street, Abercromby Square, Bedford Street North and University Square all have high quality walking environments. This has been achieved through pedestrianisation or the use of shared surfaces (Figure A.25).

Figure A.26 displays the main pedestrian attractions on the main campus, key pedestrian routes and the location of controlled pedestrian crossings.




Figure A.25: University Square

A network of pedestrian way finding boards and finder posts (Figure A.27) are placed in strategic positions around the City Centre campus. The way finding boards provide an overview of the City Centre campus and a 'you are here' marker to help staff, students and visitors navigate the campus.







Carnatic Halls of Residence

1.1 Carnatic Halls Overview

Carnatic Halls of Residence is set within its own grounds in the suburban area of Mossley Hill. Following the closure of Dale Hall, the site now comprises five residences:

- Rankin Hall (264 bedrooms)
- Lady Mountford House (241 bedrooms)
- Salisbury Hall (221 bedrooms)
- Morton House (205 bedrooms)
- McNair Hall (161 bedrooms)

Approximately 1,100 students are based at the halls. The halls surround one communal building, Carnatic House, which contains a restaurant, bar, shops and student health care centre.

The Halls of residence are in close proximity to Sefton Park and local amenities along Rose Lane, Lark Lane and Aigburth Road.

Figure A.28 shows the entrance to the halls via North Mossley Hill Road.

Vehicular Access

The halls are situated approximately 5.5km south east of Liverpool City Centre and the University's main campus. Carnatic Halls of Residence are well connected to the city via the A562 to the north of the halls and the A561 to the south of the halls, as shown in Figure A.29. The halls are located approximately 4km southwest of the M62, where connections with the wider Merseyside area and beyond can be accessed. The Carnatic site is bound by Carnatic Road to the north, Elmswood Road to the south and North Mossley Hill Road to the east.

1.1.1 Car Parking

There are approximately 150 car parking spaces for staff and student use at Carnatic Halls (Figure A.30). Staff can park on site free of charge, while students are charged £10 per term (£30 per year) for parking. Students must parked in student parking areas. Staff and students who park in unauthorised areas may be issued with a penalty notice.

Bus Access

Arriva operates a dedicated University Bus Service, the 699 that runs between the main University Campus and Carnatic Halls of Residence via Greenbank Halls of Residence. Large articulated buses depart the designated on-site bus stop (Figure A.31) every five to ten minutes at peak times and every fifteen to twenty minutes off-peak. The first bus service arrives at Carnatic at 08:05 with the last bus leaving Elliot Street in the City Centre at 23:55. Other bus services such as the 61 and 80 services stop on Rose Lane, a short walk from the halls.







A summary of all bus services which serve Carnatic Halls of Residence and the vicinity are presented in Table A.7 below.

A single journey flat fare for students travelling on Arriva buses is £1.80. The standard flat fare is £2.20 within Area C (Liverpool). It is possible for students to purchase a 'Student Saver Ticket' which offers a saving on the cost of bus travel with Arriva in the Merseyside area. Saver tickets are available for periods between a single term and a 14 month period. The 'Student Saver Ticket' is available both online via Arriva's website and within the Liverpool Guild of Students shop on campus. Train Access

Mossley Hill Train station is approximately a 500m walk away from Carnatic Halls along Rose Lane (Figure A.34). A direct service to Liverpool Lime Street is available approximately every 30 minutes from Mossley Hill station. The station is located on the Liverpool to Manchester line, with the majority of passenger services calling at this station. The service is operated by Northern Rail.





Shelter and seating is provided at both platforms, ramped disabled access to platforms is available. Unsheltered cycle parking is provided for up to 8 bicycles.

Cycling Access

Carnatic Halls are in close proximity to Sefton Park, Greenbank Park and Princes Park and a network of quieter roads providing a pleasant cycling environment. Figure A.35 shows the on and off-street cycle network in the vicinity of the halls. The University Cycle Route is in close proximity to the Carnatic Halls of residence, providing access to the City Centre and main campus via North Mossley Hill Road, Mossley Hill Drive, Brompton Avenue, Crown Street and Myrtle Street. The Trans Pennine Trail National Cycle Route 56 can also be accessed via the nearby Briardale Road, providing access to the City Centre and the wider Liverpool City Region.




Figure A.35: Cycle Routes in the Vicinity of Carnatic Halls

Pedestrian Access

The halls are surrounded by quiet roads and parks providing a pleasant walking environment in close proximity to the halls. The walking environment immediately surrounding the site is good with footways and lighting on both sides of the carriageway of Elmswood Road and a pelican crossing linking the halls on either side of the road as shown in Figure A.37. North Mossley Hill Road has a poorer walking environment with no footway available on the southbound side of the carriageway to the east of the site.

Greenbank Halls of Residence

Greenbank Halls Overview

Greenbank Halls of Residence are located approximately 1.6km from Carnatic in Mossley Hill, a suburban area of the City. As part of the University's Residential Strategy, Derby and Rathbone Halls (Figure A.38) closed at the end of the academic year in 2014 and form part of the proposed redevelopment of Greenbank Student Village which will be ready for the 2016/17 academic year. The site is now made up of one residence, Roscoe and Gladstone Hall, which will remain open throughout 2014 and 2015. The hall currently provides 390 catered student bedrooms.

Three full sized grass football pitches are located within the Greenbank residences that are reserved for student use only and host a number of weekly Campus League football matches.

Site Accessibility

Vehicular Access

Greenbank Halls are located on Greenbank Lane, in between both Greenbank and Sefton Park, approximately 5km from Liverpool City Centre and the main campus. The halls are bound by Greenbank Lane to the north, Greenbank Road to the east, Ibbotsons Lane to the south and Mossley Hill Drive to the west. Although surrounded by green space and relatively quiet roads, the halls are well connected to the city via the A562 to the north, the B5175 to the west and the A561 to the south of the halls, as shown in Figure A.39. The halls are located approximately 4km southwest of the M62, for connections with the wider Liverpool City Region and beyond.


Car Parking

Car parking provision at Roscoe and Gladstone is extremely limited on site with approximately 48 spaces provided for staff and students (Figure A.40). There are a limited number of car parking spaces available



for student use within Greenbank. Those students with mobility issues get priority car parking. Access to the car park is granted via fob access at the site entrance gate. A charge of £10 a term is payable for use of student car parking.





Students park along the eastbound carriageway of Greenbank Lane (Figure A.41). Parking along Greenbank Lane is limited during busy periods e.g. when the football pitches are in use.

Public Transport Access

Bus

Similarly to Carnatic, Greenbank Halls are directly served by the 699 University bus service operated by Arriva. Other bus services to the City Centre, include the 173 which can be accessed via a stop outside the entrance to Roscoe and Gladstone Halls on Greenbank Lane and the 75, 80, 80A and 86 which stop a short walk from the halls along Smithdown Road.

The bus stops serving the halls of residence are of a mixed quality with good quality stops along Greenbank Road offering seating, shelter, information and Kassel kerbs (Figure A.42), to stops on Greenbank Lane that offer no shelter or seating (Figure A.43). It should be noted however that the low quality stops are located where footway space is limited.

Wyncote Sports Ground Overview

Wyncote sports ground has some of the best University sports facilities in the country with ten grass football pitches, four grass rugby pitches, one 3G rugby training area, two hockey pitches, one lacrosse pitch, an 18peg fishing pond and a pavilion that provides a dedicated meeting room and training facility.

Facilities attract a high number of users and are available to staff, students and visitors between 09:00-21:30 Monday to Friday, 09:00-18:00 on Saturdays and 10:00-16:00 on Sundays.

Site Accessibility

Vehicular Access

Wyncote sports ground is located in the Mossley Hill Area, approximately 7km southeast of Liverpool City Centre and within 2km of both Carnatic and Greenbank halls of residence. The site is in close proximity to a network of A Roads providing good connections with the City Centre, the main campus and beyond as shown in Figure A.47.




Figure A.47: Map of Wyncote Sports Ground and Local Road Nework



Car Parking

Car parking for the sports grounds can be accessed off Mather Avenue and is located just behind the fishing pond. There is limited car parking available and spaces are unmarked. The Supermarket car park is used as unofficial overflow parking by students.

Public Transport Access & Facilities

Bus Access

The sports ground is located on a major bus route and as a result, services operate a frequency of 15 minutes or better past the site, to and from the city centre and south of Liverpool.

The most frequent of these services is the 86/86A/86D which can be accessed from Mather Avenue and runs at a frequency of every 6 minutes Monday to Friday, 12 minutes of an evening, 6 minutes on a Saturday and 10 minutes on a Sunday. The 86 services run between Liverpool and Garston, Liverpool South Parkway or Liverpool John Lennon Airport, and is one of the services operated as part of the Quality Bus Network Partnership between Merseytravel, Arriva, Stagecoach and Liverpool City Council.

Other services that run in close proximity to the sports grounds include the 61, 68, 80, and 80A, which all run at 15 minute intervals during weekdays and provide access to the wider Liverpool region.

The majority of bus stops in close proximity to the sports grounds are of a high quality specification and provide shelter, seating, timetable information and Kassel kerbs.

Grass verges separate footways from the carriageway on theB5108 Mather Avenue off which the site access id located. To the north of the site is Rose Lane and Allerton Road which experience high pedestrian activity, footways and pedestrian crossings are located along these routes.



Leahurst Campus

Leahurst Campus Overview

The Leahurst Veterinary campus is located on the Wirral Peninsula, approximately 12 miles from Liverpool City Centre and 9 miles from Chester. The Leahurst campus provides practical experience for 340 4th and 5th year veterinary students. Approximately 450 staff are based at the campus to operate the following facilities:

- Small animal hospital 10,000 referrals/year, mainly cats and dogs;
- Equine hospital 2,000 referrals/year;
- Pathology services Includes post-mortem facilities;
- Wood Park Farm Including visitor centre;
- Ness Heath Farm; and
- Continuing professional development seminars.

Students are expected to live within close proximity to the campus as they are required to be 'on-call' for parts of their 36 week training rotation. A small number of students stay on site to monitor emergency cases

Site Accessibility

Vehicular Access

Leahurst campus is located off the A540 Chester High Road (Figures A.49 and A.50). The A540 links Hoylake to the north west with Chester to the south east of the campus.

The M53 and A41 are located within 4 miles of the campus. The M53 runs between Chester and Birkenhead and is directly accessible from the Kingsway (Wallasey) tunnel. The A41 runs from Birkenhead to Wolverhampton, passing through east Wirral, Chester and wider Cheshire region.

The M56 is located approximately 5 miles from the campus and connects with the M53, M6, M62 and M60 wider motorway network.






Figure A.50: Map of Leahurst Campus and Local Road Network

Car Parking

There are approximately 300 car park spaces at the Leahurst campus for use by staff and students. Additional car parking is provided for clients of the small animal and equine hospitals.



All staff and students are provided with a staff/student handbook prior to starting employment/study at the campus. The handbook provides clear instruction of where staff and students are permitted to park. Staff and students are required to display a parking permit in their vehicle if they wish to park on campus.

Bus Access

Public transport provision is poor to the Campus. The nearest bus stop to the site is located on Hanns Hall Road which is in use for school services. The X22 and 272 services stop on Hinderton Road (approximately an 11 minute walk from the campus) and operates on an hourly timetable during peak times. The X22 provides access from Heswall to Chester via Neston and the 272 operates between Ellesmere Port bus station and Neston.

There is no direct bus service to Liverpool City Centre. The closest direct bus service to Liverpool is the 487 which can be alighted from Brook Street or Mellock Lane, approximately a 30 minute walk away from the Leahurst campus. Table A.12 below summarises bus services in the vicinity of the site.

Train Access

The closest railway stations are Neston and Hooton. Neston is located on the Wrexham to Bidston line, an hourly service is in operation on this line during peak times. Hooton is located on the Liverpool to Chester/Ellesmere Port line with services every 15 minutes during peak times. The campus is approximately 3km from Neston Station and 5km from Hooton Station. There is no bus linking these stations directly with the site.

Cycling Access

Cycling is a popular mode of travel to the campus, particularly during the warmer months. Several off and on-road routes are located in close proximity of the campus (Figure A.53) including National Cycle Route 56 which runs along the A540 in close proximity to the campus and connects in the east to National Cycle Route 70, offering a direct cycle link to Liverpool and Chester. Cycle parking is provided throughout the campus, examples of cycle parking around the site are presented in Figure A.54.








Figure A.54: Bicycle Storage Provision at Leahurst



Pedestrian Access

The closest residential areas to the campus are Neston, Little Neston and Willaston. Willaston is located closest to the campus, approximately 2.5km from campus. Although 2.5km is not an unreasonable distance to walk for most people, there are limited footpaths and crossing facilities in the vicinity of the campus due to the rural location of the campus. There is a very narrow footway which is often overgrown and poorly surfaced leading from Hanns Hall Road to the main entrance to the Leahurst site.



Ness Gardens

Ness Gardens Overview

The University Botanical Gardens are located in Wirral south of Little Neston, in close proximity to the Leahurst campus. The gardens were presented to the University in 1948 to be kept as botanical gardens available to the public.

The Gardens are open six days a week (closed on Tuesdays) all year round with a charge of £7.15 for adults and £6.50 concessions to enter the gardens. The site has become well renowned across the UK for its botanical research, conservation and education.

Site Accessibility

Vehicular Access

Ness Botanical Gardens are located off Neston Road, around 2km south of the village of Little Neston and 2km north of Burton (Figure A.55). Liverpool is located approximately 20km north east of the site and Chester 16km south east. The M53 and A41 are located to the east of Ness Gardens and are key vehicle distributors, the site to Liverpool, Chester and beyond.,.






Figure A.55: Map of Ness Gardens and Local Road Network


